

Instructions for authors (Series D: Paleontology and Anthropology)

We welcome contributions from both researchers of the National Museum of Nature and Science (NMNS) and other institutions. Submissions from outside researchers are to be co-authored with the NMNS researchers or contain work based on the collection of the NMNS. Other manuscripts will be considered for publication if the relevant specimens are donated to the NMNS before submission. Manuscripts must not have been published already, nor are they under consideration for publication or in press elsewhere. Nomenclatural names must have been registered in public academic systems (e.g., ZooBank) by the author(s). Manuscripts are peer-reviewed by referees for consideration of publication. The Editorial Committee reserves the right to decide acceptance or reject of the manuscript.

Full original papers are limited preferably to 30 printed pages in length including tables and figures. Material reports on the collection of NMNS are also considered for publication.

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Manuscripts should be prepared in English except for the Japanese translation of the title. The title page, abstract, text, references and figure legends must be contained in a single Word file (.doc) readable in Windows. Page layout of the manuscript should be A4 paper size with double spacing. Margins should be 2.5 cm on each side and 3 cm at the top and bottom of the pages. Use Times or Times New Roman font (12 point) except for the Japanese translation of the title, which should be typed in Gothic or Mincho font (12 points).

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Title page should contain 1) title, 2) author's name(s) and address(es), 3) the corresponding author's name, complete address, ~~phone~~, and e-mail address, 4) number of figures and tables, 5) running title not to exceed 50 characters including spaces. and 6) Japanese translation of the title. Authors not versed in Japanese may ask the Editor to produce the Japanese translation of the title.

Abstract should be a lucid digest of the paper, not exceeding 200 words.

Key words not more than five.

Text normally including Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, and Acknowledgments.

References cited in the text should be arranged alphabetically according to the name(s) of

author(s). Text reference should be made by the author's surname followed by the year of publication. [for example: Miyashiro (1961) or (Miyashiro, 1961)]. If the number of authors is three or more, use, for example, Suzuki et al. (1991) or (Suzuki et al., 1991). Each reference should be given in the following form and names of neither journals nor books should be abbreviated:
